Launch of \$4 million Kong Meng San – Community Development Council COVID-19 Relief Fund

The COVID-19 pandemic affects everyone in one way or another. In times of physical distancing, the Community Development Councils (CDCs) are building bridges of kindness and compassion through the Many Helping Hands approach, bringing together corporate and religious institutions to help complement the efforts of the Government. This "Many Helping Hands" approach has helped to build a stronger and more resilient Singapore.

- The five CDCs are pleased to partner Kong Meng San Phor Kark See Monastery (KMSPKS) in setting up a new \$4 million Kong Meng San-CDC COVID-19 Relief Fund to help more Singaporeans households, regardless of religions, affected by the COVID-19 pandemic through loss of jobs, retrenchment or total loss of income.
- 3 This is the first-time a religious institution has donated such a large amount (\$2 million) to the five CDCs for a COVID-19 Relief initiative. The Monastery is grateful to be given this opportunity to contribute to society by helping people during this challenging time. With this donation, the CDCs will match the donation with their own \$2 million, making a total of \$4 million for the KMS-CDC COVID-19 Relief.
- This afternoon, our Guest-of-Honour, Mr Masagos Zulkifli, Minister for Social and Family Development and Second Minister for Health, launched the KMS-CDC **COVID-19 Relief Fund** at a simple ceremony at the KMSPKS Meditation Hall, together with Chairman of Mayors' Committee and Minister of State Mayor Low Yen Ling, Mayor Denise Phua, Mayor Desmond Choo, Mayor Alex Yam, Mayor Fahmi Aliman, as well as Abbot Venerable Sik Kwang Sheng, Mr Chng Hwee Hong, Deputy Chairman of KMSPKS Finance and Investment Committee, and Mr Lim Hock Yu, Chief Executive Director, People's Association.

- 5 KMSPKS and Community Partners such as Grassroots Organisations will identify the beneficiaries for this Fund. This Fund aims to assist up to 8,000 households with each eligible household receiving a one-off assistance of \$500.
- The **KMS CDC COVID-19 Relief Fund** is only open to Singaporeans aged 21 years old and above who are currently unemployed and have experienced a total loss of income due to non-voluntary no pay leave, retrenchment or termination for at least three months at point of application. Each successful applicant (and his/ her household) will receive a one-time relief of \$500.
- 7 To ensure that more households can benefit from the Fund, household beneficiary should not be the recipients of other CDC-related COVID-19 Relief Funds.

- (c) Connector of Communities
