12,000 STUDENTS TO BENEFIT FROM CDC STUDENT MEALS SCHEME

Part of Singapore Together Movement

14 APRIL 2020, SINGAPORE - More help is on the way for some 12,000 students from low-income families staying in rental blocks during the circuit breaker period in Singapore.

Singapore Together

- At the recent Supplementary Budget 2020 round-up speech, Deputy Prime Minister Heng Swee Keat called forth individuals and corporates to step forward to support Singaporeans in need in the spirit of Singapore Together.
- 3 Led by the Mayors, their five Community Development Councils (CDCs), being the Aggregator of Community Resources on the ground, are mobilising and tapping on collective energies and ideas of their strong network of partners to help the vulnerable in the community.

"CDC Student Meals Scheme" Announcement

- The CDCs are partnering Dr Tahir, a philanthropist, as well as Grab Singapore, to launch the CDC Student Meals Scheme, on 14 April 2020.
- 5 The Scheme is targeted at primary and secondary school students living in units under the Public Rental Scheme. The aim is to help these families to defray the cost of buying meals while the students are on home-based learning (HBL) during the circuit breaker period. Eligible students will be given e-vouchers, in the form of GrabFood vouchers, to buy meals from over 7,000 participating food merchants in Singapore. The Scheme harnesses the use of technology to promote social distancing. This is also aligned to the CDCs' effort to encourage more people to embrace the Smart Nation initiative through utilising technology to better serve residents' needs.

















Donation

- A total of \$660,000 will be set aside for the **CDC Student Meals Scheme**.
- 7 Dr Tahir, a Singapore Permanent Resident and founder of Mayapada Group, donated \$300,000 to this scheme. The CDCs will match dollar-for-dollar this donation with another \$300,000. In addition, Grab is also contributing \$60,000¹ to the Scheme.

Community Support Powered by Technology

- 8 The Scheme is powered by Grab's platform, where Grab will help CDC disburse the vouchers to eligible students who can offset their costs of meals at eligible GrabFood merchants (See Annex A for food items available). Grab's wide merchant base (including those providing Halal food) and consumer reach will make it easy for students to get their vouchers and benefit from this Scheme.
- 9 100% of the funding received will be converted into CDC-branded GrabFood vouchers for the scheme. Eligible students will each receive \$55 to order and pick-up hot meals from neighbouring merchants with a self pick-up option on the GrabFood app during the circuit breaker period. The students can pre-order their meals with the self-pickup option and collect it when it is ready. It will also help the students to avoid queues and limits their time spent outside home during this HBL period. This Scheme also aims to improve business demand for heartland food merchants via self pick-up.

"This whole-of-community response from a philanthropist, a private sector company and the five CDCs to support needy children from rental blocks comes at a crucial time when many lives and support systems are disrupted due to COVID-19.

We hope that it will also bring relief to their parents as they try to cope during this challenging time.

In addition, heartland F&B businesses on the Grab network will receive a boost from this initiative with the island-wide participation of all five CDCs in this scheme."

Eligibility and Application

- 17 To qualify for the CDC Student Meals Scheme, the eligibility criteria are as follows:
 - Students currently in Primary and/or Secondary Schools living in rental a) blocks; and
 - Must be part of a households with at least one Singaporean Citizen b) staying in units under the public rental scheme.
- 18 Each eligible student will receive 11 GrabFood vouchers in \$5 denomination to be used up to 31 May 2020. The vouchers must be utilised in full as no refund will be made for any unused value. See Annex B for details on how to sign-up. Annex C is a sample copy of the CDC GrabFood Voucher. Annex D is a step-by-step guide on how to redeem the GrabFood vouchers and Annex E is a guide on how to use the Grab App.
- 19 Sign-up period for this scheme is from 14 to 27 April 2020.

CDC STUDENT MEALS SCHEME

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is this CDC Student Meals scheme?

This new scheme initiated by the CDCs hopes to help families with children studying in Primary and/or Secondary Schools and living in rental blocks defray the cost of buying meals while the children are on home-based learning (HBL) during circuit breaker period. A total of \$660,000 will support up to 12,000 students. Each child will receive \$55.00 worth of CDC e-vouchers via the Grab app, in \$5 denomination to be used during the circuit breaker period, up to 31 May 2020.

2. Who qualifies for the scheme?

Vulnerable students currently studying in Primary and Secondary Schools and part of a household with at least one Singaporean Citizen staying in units under the public rental scheme may sign up for the scheme.

3. How does eligible student sign-up for the scheme?

Eligible students will have to sign up for the scheme via email to their respective CDCs. The parent/ caregiver of the child will need to provide the information (of each child) in the format below:

4. What should eligible students do to receive the e-vouchers?

Respective CDC will verify the sign-up and if eligible, issue the \$55 e-vouchers (in the form of GrabFood vouchers) into the respective accounts (through Grab app) within four working days after signing up.

















Existing Grab User

Existing Grab users may use their existing accounts, so long the mobile number provided to CDC is the registered number in Grab.

New Grab User

After emailing their respective CDCs, the parent/ caretaker should immediately download the Grab app and create an account, linking it to the mobile number provided to their CDC.

Please go to https://www.grab.com/sg/download to download the Grab app.

5. Where can the e-vouchers be utilised?

- E-vouchers can be used only on GrabFood platform, for ordering from GrabFood merchants for self-pick-up orders only.
- The e-vouchers worth \$5 each are to offset cost of food purchased via self-pick-up, and have to be utilised in full as no refund will be made for any unused value / amount.
- If the cost of food to be purchased is more than \$5.00, the difference can be paid via your personal debit card, or via GrabPay (if you have topped up sufficient credit).
- E-voucher is not exchangeable for cash.

6. How do I use the e-vouchers in the Grab app?

Please refer to Annex D Step by step guide to redeeming CDC-branded GrabFood vouchers.

7. Do I need mobile data to access the Grab app when self-pick-up my order?

No, there is no need to have mobile data when self-pick-up the order.

After placing the self-pick-up order at home via the GrabFood app, simply take a screenshot of the order confirmation or take note of the order number and you can proceed to pick up your order using the screenshot or order number.













8. What is the validity period of the vouchers?

The e-vouchers will be loaded into the respective Grab account in \$5 denomination i.e. 11 x \$5 e-vouchers.

The vouchers will be valid from date of issue to Sunday, 31 May 2020 inclusive.

9. What should residents do if the e-voucher doesn't work?

Residents can use the 'Help Centre' option in their Grab app to report an issue.

10. Who should I approach if I require more clarification/information e.g. what if I don't own a mobile phone?

In view of the current circuit breaker measures, CDC offices are closed. Residents may write-in to their respective CDCs for more information.
